Council, leadership, and staff have been hard at work preparing for the Fall when Pastor Leesa is on sabbatical and I am on parental leave. We are excited for Pastor Karri, our coverage pastor, and so grateful for the hard work of our key leaders. Staff and leaders have a plan to ensure that programming from Adult Ministry to Care, Prayer, and Support will happen during those weeks. Pastor Karri will oversee worship, pastoral care, and other duties.

I especially encourage you to get to know the children and young people seated near you. Find out what sports or instruments they play, what their favorite TV show is, or what their hopes are for this summer vacation. Start now so that when fall comes, you can connect with other adults, children, and youth when Pastor Leesa and I aren't around to do so.

Sabbatical and parental leave are not just for us as pastors. The Holy Spirit continues to be at work in our congregation, ministry continues to happen, even when your pastors aren't in the building. You all will learn more about who you are as a congregation, your amazing capacity for ministry, and your capacity to build and maintain relationships.

Thank you for stepping into this experience with courage and faithfulness. I imagine that we will all return with stories and praise for the God that promises to show up even where we least expect it.

Meet Pastor Karri Anderson our Coverage Pastor during Pastor Leesa's Sabbatical:

Pastor Karri received an Associate of Arts degree in Nursing from Anoka-Ramsey Community College and later graduated from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota with a Master of Divinity in 1994. Her internship year at the seminary was spent as a resident chaplain at North Memorial Hospital in Robbinsdale, and after graduation she worked as an LSS chaplain in a large senior long-term care facility in New Hope. In 1997 she received her first call as Pastor of Congregational Care at Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Maple Grove and began serving as an intentional interim pastor in 2006. Her ministry experience has been diverse, serving from solo to senior pastorates, inner city to rural settings, and in congregations with less than 50 members to those with over 7000.



Ministry Continues during Sabbatical:

Beginning August 1, <u>Pastor Karri's</u> responsibilities include areas Pastor Leesa typically tends to:
Planning Sunday morning worship, overseeing pastoral Care, teaching adult Life-long Learning studies, some Administration, supporting volunteers and attending events. Pastor Karri will not be making any mission and vision decisions, but is covering the day to day ministry.
<u>Pastor Courtney</u> will continue in her ¾ Associate Pastor role until her baby arrives in early
September, when she will take a 10-week parental leave. <u>Pastor Leesa</u> will keep in touch with the congregation through a regular "Where in the World is Pastor Leesa" video message.
<u>Church Council & Ministry Teams</u> are planning ministry opportunities before Pastor Leesa leaves for sabbatical that will be ready to implement while she is gone.



Finances during Sabbatical:

The funds for pastoral coverage will be part of our 2024 budget. In order to meet this goal, we need member giving to match the 2024 budget the congregation approved at the Annual Meeting.
